

DEATH OF F. STRAW.

Several weeks ago the readers of THE HERALD will remember that we gave a short account of the death of Fred Straw. The following is from the Perris, Cal., New Era:

Died, at his residence in Perris, on Monday morning, Oct. 11, 1897, F. Straw, aged 50 years.

The deceased was born in Dauphin Co., Pa., October 11, 1847, and had he lived until the 13th, would have been 50 years of age. He came to Perris about 6 years ago, partially in search of health. On account of his occupation, that of a dealer in real estate, he was well known not only throughout Southern California, but in the Eastern States also, and by his indomitable push and energy, we can safely say that no other man has done more for the up building, or brought into this valley more monied men than the late Fred Straw. He was a man who attended strictly to his own business, and by his genial manner and perseverance won the esteem and friendship of every one he came in contact with. The deceased, with his wife and family only came up from Los Angeles, where they had been sojourning, about three weeks ago, and from that time until his death, he was confined to his bed, and though everything was done for him, by medical skill and the best of care and attention, life departed to the great beyond at 6:30 on Monday morning. He leaves a widow and two bright boys to mourn his loss, who have the sympathy of their large circle of friends.
