

George Wilson Duguid

Eldest son of Mr. and Mrs. Wilson Duguid, was born March 1, 1884, and died Nov. 6, 1907, aged 23 years, 8 months and 5 days.

He was a student of the Tri-State college in 1902. Dec. 21, 1904, he was married to Miss Edna Turner, of Eaton Rapids, Mich., and to them were born two children—Frederick Wilson and Vilah Mildred. They spent the greater part of their married life on a farm near Eaton
